Costs Involved.

Three prices were obtained; the most favourable being for £350.00 – details provided below.

Grant Sought.

We are applying for the council to fund 50% of the preferred cost i.e. £175.00.

Brief Overview.

To create a website with the appropriate pages and feedbacks to inform members, and potential members, of club activities and facilities, to gain feedback and better direct the club's activities in supporting and developing a centre that increasingly supports local social needs.

Why the project is needed.

To complement the Facebook page currently used by the club. Facebook has neither the scope nor the flexibility to adequately communicate club activities. Few secure venues in the locality open at socialising times (e.g. The Bowls Club and The Hive have restricted hours) and the Bright Steels Social Club fills that gap.

We are developing a programme of activities to reach further out into the community – activities aimed at attracting new members and increasing the diversity of members; the website will support these activities.

Consultation & Financial Details.

A specification for the website has been produced and submitted to three potential suppliers. The build was specified in a number of stages; quotations were sought for the first stage only:

- Ryedale Web Design (Duncan Hardy) the exercise in full considered too complex and the offer to provide the work was declined.
- Computer FX (very busy at the time) concluded the project was too complex, presumably considered in its totality and produced a remarkably expensive quote.
- Chris Branston, a club member who understands the club and its activities, provided a quote for the first part of the build at £350.00.

No further quotes were sought on the basis that (with the experience of the two other quotes) it would take a disproportionate amount of time and effort to reduce Mr. Branston's figure of £350.00.

Bright Steels Social Club Website Application

Measure of Success.

The measure of success will be a Bright Steels Social Club website which is agreed as fully functional by the officers of the club and club members with special responsibility, for example the pool, darts and catering organisers.

How the Project Supports the Community.

The Bright Steels Social Club provides a Hub for the local community and especially the older members whose mobility may be poor and being able to socialise is important for their well-being. The Club also supports 4 full-time-equivalent jobs.

There is immense potential to increase support for, and involvement in, a secure environment for the local community where the club would be made more widely accessible through improved communication (the website).

Additionally, the club is active in supporting local charities, some of which use the club. Examples of charitable support are provided as appendices.
