Planning Applications - September 2025

ZE25/00922/LBC Replacement of the two existing Help Points at Malton Railway Station, Malton, Railway Station Norton Road Norton North Yorkshire YO17 9RD

Listed Building Consent is sought for the renewal of the existing two Help Points at *Malton Railway Station*, with state-of-the-art technology to replace the existing equipment which is towards the end of its life-cycle. Similar enhancements to station Help Points are being made throughout the TransPennine Express Franchise network.

2 JUSTIFICATION FOR THE APPLICATION

A TransPennine Express Franchise obligation is for the incumbent *Train Operating Company (TOC)* to enhance the information available to all those using or meeting trains on the TransPennine Express Franchise network. The proposed works are required to discharge this obligation. The replacement Help Points proposed are of contemporary design, but will not have an increased impact on the heritage of *Malton Railway Station* visually.

Additional benefits include lower operational and maintenance costs.

Dear Sir/Madam, Planning Application comments have been made. A summary of the comments is provided below. Comments were submitted at 20/08/2025 9:04 PM from Miss Nicholette Scotter.

Customer made comments in support of the Planning Application Reasons for comment: Comments: 20/08/2025 Where I fully support my neighbours plans for the new extension I have definite concerns about the effects of the removal of the outbuildings attached to the boundary/party wall and removal of this boundary/party wall up to my front kitchen wall. I have already emailed the planning department about my concerns.

On the 12/08/25 I emailed the case officer Jack Thompson using the application no ZE25/00775/GPDE. (planning.rye@northyorks.gov.uk) I followed up the email 2 days later (14/08/25) and spoke to a planning officer. She advised me to again submit my concerns as the planning application had been resubmitted under a new application no. with a new case officer.

My concerns are as follows - 1 2 The actual party wall forms a side wall of my kitchen. This wall is only 9 inches thick (a brick length). The front of the kitchen and the other side wall is a single construction with an external render and internally all three walls insulated and 'plasterboarded'. Removing the outbuildings and the boundary wall plus, digging the footings for the steel structure will potentially cause movement and vibrations that could impact upon the structure of my

kitchen. I'm meeting with the builder next week to share my concerns. I have also spoken to a structural engineer. Please note that the applicant has failed to apply for the boundary/party wall to be demolished up to my kitchen wall. In essence - I do NOT object to my neighbours extension. I am worried about my kitchens structure being adversely affected. I am waiting for the relevant party wall notices to be served and the awards made by their architect prior to the works commencing. I would like the original email (ZE25/00775/GPDE) to be included in the comments area. Thank you.

All members approved in principle but the issues with the neighbours property and party wall must be considered and resolved.
